Aaron Vogel Selected to Represent 47th District in 'An Artistic Discovery' Program
WASHINGTON, D.C. – Congresswoman Loretta Sanchez, welcomed Orange County High School of the Arts student Aaron Vogel, 17, to Capitol Hill today. Vogel, an Orange, Calif. resident, was recently selected to join more than 400 students from across the nation to display artwork in the Capitol as part of the 'An Artistic Discovery' program.

An Artistic Discovery is the annual nationwide Congressional High School Art Competition initiated by Members of the U.S. House of Representatives. This contest has afforded more than 650, 000 high school students the opportunity to express their rich artistic talents in a variety of styles. Each Congressional District hosts its own competition resulting in more than 5,000 local contests since the competition's inception in 1982.

This year's painting from the 47th Congressional District of California is an oil rendering of the Floral Park neighborhood, home to Congresswoman Sanchez, in Santa Ana, California. Vogel's painting, entitled "Rhonda's House," will be on display in the halls of the U.S. Capitol until next year's recipient is selected.
